UNIT OUTLINE + 5 LESSON SCRIPTS

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Lesson 1: Baby Moses in a Basket

Exploration Stations – build a basket, sink or float, book nook, coloring, Moses Match

Bible Story Time - Exodus 2:1-10 – Many years ago, the Israelites, were slaves in Egypt. There that the Egyptians were afraid that the Israelites would take over Egypt. So Pharaoh, the king, ordered all the boys born to the Hebrews to be killed. During this time a Hebrew woman gave birth to a son. She hid him for 3 months so he would not be killed. After 3 months, when she could no longer hide him, she made out of papyrus reeds. She put the baby in the basket and laid it along the Nile River. The princess stood back to watch and see what would happen. Soon, Pharaoh's daughter came to bathe in the river. She saw the basket and sent her maid to get it. When she opened it, she saw the baby. The little princess felt sorry for him. Then, Miriam went to the princess and asked if she should find a Hebrew nurse for the baby. The princess agreed, so Miriam called the baby's mother to nurse and take care of the baby. When the boy was older, his mother brought him back to the princess who adopted him as her son. This is how Moses was born, which means "lifted out of the water."

Comprehension Questions – 1. Why did the baby's mother hide him for 3 months? (the Pharaoh ordered all the Hebrew boys to be killed.) 2. What did the mother do with the baby after 3 months? (hid him in the basket.) 3. Who found the basket? (the princess) 4. How do you think Moses' mother felt when she found the basket? (sad) How did she feel when the princess asked her to nurse him until he was older? (happy)

Prayer Time – God is powerful. He used his power to protect Moses and the Israelites, and he answers our prayers. Who has something we can pray about today?

Games – 1. Floating the Nile game. 2. Bible Verse match and practice
