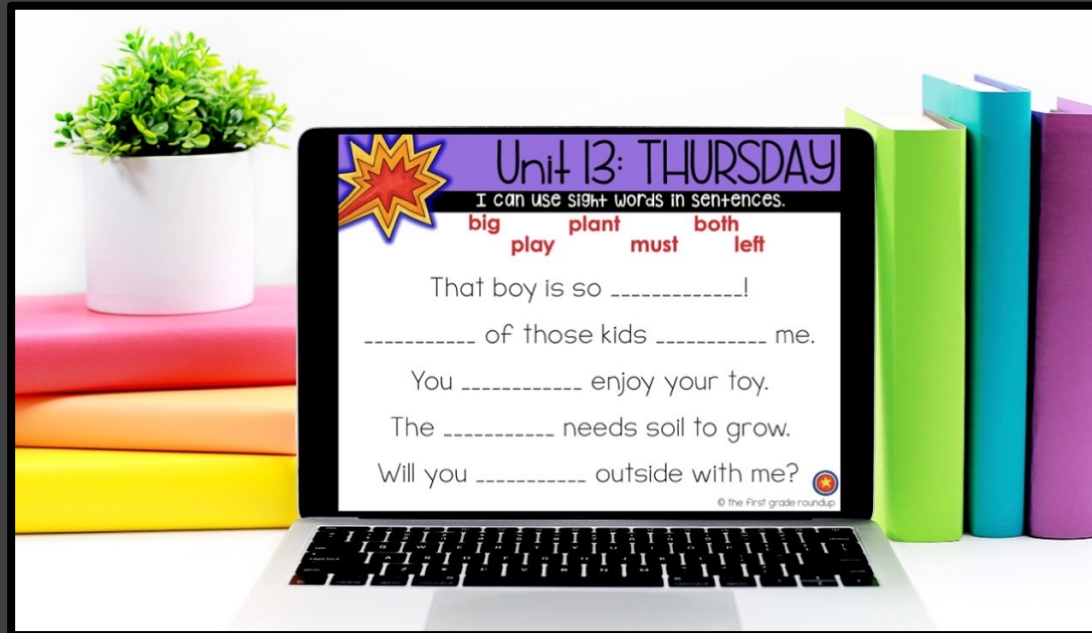

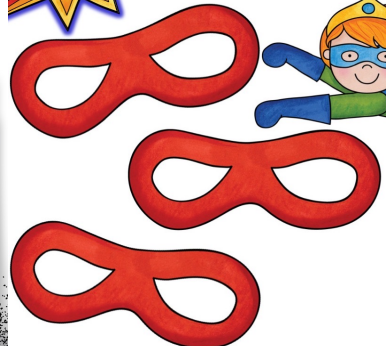

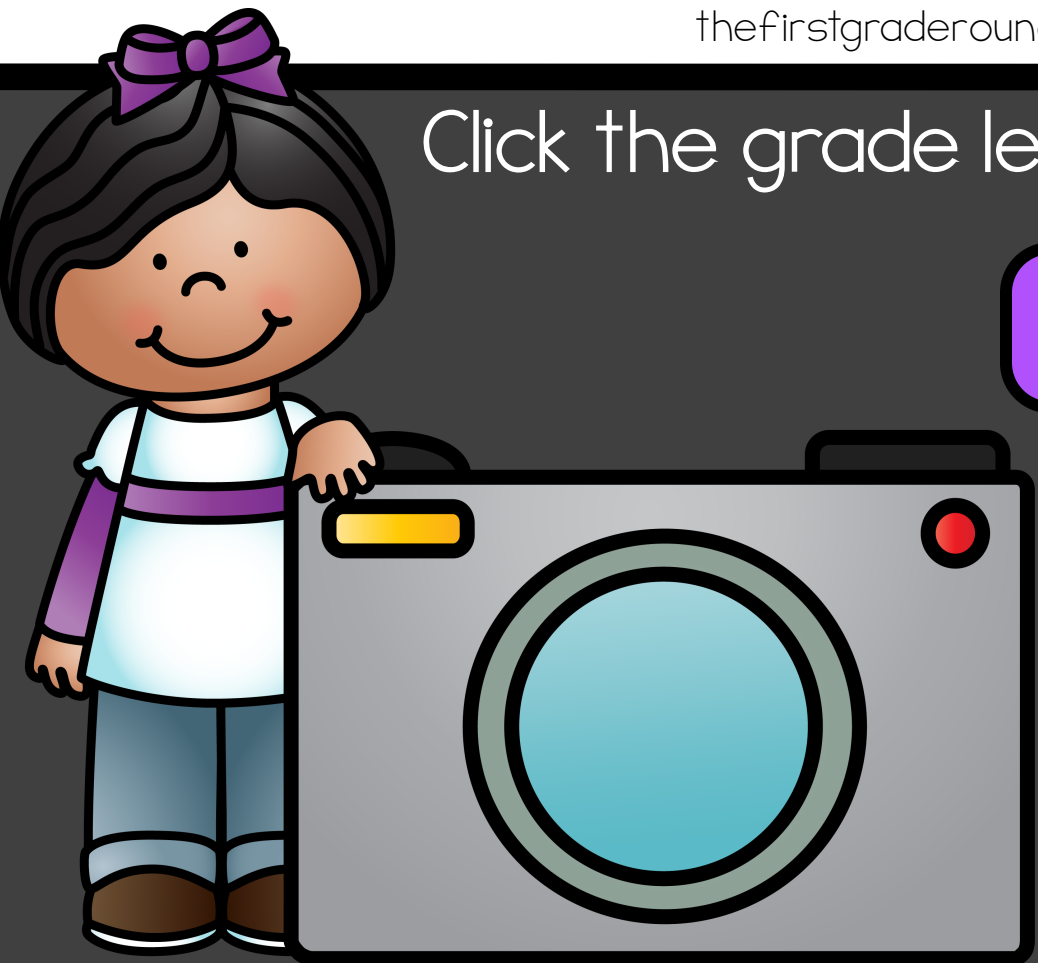

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

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WHAT IS the SUPER PHONICS CURRICULUM?

Super Phonics is a digital curriculum that includes everything you need to teach your 20-30 minute block of explicit phonics--*digitally*! The digital slides are created to help you put down the script and click through the slides to teach the content in a purposeful, age-appropriate, and engaging way.

WHY SUPER PHONICS?

Super Phonics aligns with the Science of Reading which means kids will be exposed to sounds in a strategic way backed by years of brain research. And thanks to the predictable routine of the Super Phonics slides, your students will gain confidence and engage quickly to maximize learning.

CAN THIS CURRICULUM BE USED IN GOOGLE SLIDES?

Yes! Just simply upload the file to your Google Drive and then open with Slides. Very few things are different. You may lose some of the sound effects. The only other difference is that the decoding slides show the entire word on each click instead of showing it in chunks like in the powerpoint file. You may use the file in Google Slides, but please remember that a single license is for your personal classroom and may not be shared with your team, school or district. WHAT ABOUT SMALL GROUPS, INTERVENTIONS, OR CENTER WORK?

This curriculum includes direct and explicit phonics lessons. They are intended for the whole group phonics block in a regular classroom, or could be used for explicit phonics lessons in intervention or small groups to introduce or review phonics skills altogether. This resource does not include supplemental resources for additional small group or center work. You can find supplemental phonics materials that coordinate with this curriculum like decodable readers here: bit.ly/shopdecodables

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE TO TEACH PHONICS?

Once students (and you!) learn the routine, whole group phonics takes about 30 minutes in Kinder and 20 minutes in first or second grade. You will teach the explicit phonics lessons Monday-Thursday in 1st and 2nd grade and Fridays for part of the year in Kinder.

WHAT ABOUT FRIDAY PHONICS?

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Super Phonics Letter Discrimination and Letter ID units have digital lessons for Monday through Friday for each unit. This is to kick off kindergarten with a strong foundation in phonics and to give kids a consistent routine each day of the week.

However, starting with Super Phonics Letter Sounds (K) and on through 2nd grade, **this digital curriculum is only for Monday - Thursday.**

So what happens on Fridays in a Super Phonics classroom?

As you know, Fridays can be busy and very much a “catch all” day in the primary classroom. Keeping this curriculum Monday-Thursday allows for “real life” holidays, snow days, assemblies, etc, that may keep you from doing phonics. Friday can also be a “test” or “check up” day. Not all primary classrooms have traditional spelling tests, but having Friday off allows for this option.

What do Super Phonics Kinder Check Ups look like?

In Kindergarten, the goal is for students to be able to associate letters and sounds and apply them to words. This looks like giving students a chance to show they can write letters to match sounds independently.

For example, the “spelling words” in Unit I2 for kindergarten are: A, a, M, m, am. For a Friday check up test, I would give students handwriting paper and ask them to write the capital letter that says “/a/ as in apple.” The other option would be, “Write the beginning sound plus any other sounds you hear in apple.” This option would give your higher students a chance to show how well they can segment and write new words for an extension.

What are fluency folders?

Fluency folders are to second graders what poetry folders are in K-1. It's just a place to keep their fluency passages that go along with each unit. I use a 3 ring binder for these, print and copy the fluency passages and 3 hole punch them, and then put them on their desks to add into their folder on Monday mornings.

Why should I do fluency folders?

Each passage in this 2nd grade phonics curriculum is written to encourage good pacing, great expression, and good phrasing. And the passages are written with each week's focus skill and sight words in mind!

What are the fluency passages based on?

The passages are intended to be read fluently in one minute or less. This is based on Scholastic's suggestions for 2nd grade words per minute. The WPM used for each units are as follows:

- Units 1-6: 50 wpm
- Units 7-12: 60 wpm
- Units 13-18: 70 wpm
- Units 19-23: 80 wpm
- Units 24-28: 85 wpm
- Units 29-33: 90 wpm
